We are excited to share with you the first issue of the UNCT Iraq Quarterly Bulletin. This newsletter provides an overview of key activities and updates from the UNCT Iraq. Below are the key highlights for May, June, July, and August:

A New Partnership Framework for UN Collective Support to Iraq

Baghdad- October 2023, UN in Iraq, in collaboration with Government partners, formally launched the development process for a new United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF) for 2025-2029. This framework will outline the UN's collective offer of support to Iraq's national development priorities, as articulated in the forthcoming National Development Plan 2024-2028, Iraq Vision 2030, and SDGs. Under the leadership of the Minister of Planning and the UN Resident Coordinator, and with broad representation from government ministries, departments, and UN agencies, a dedicated Joint Technical Committee (JTC) was established to ensure effective coordination and consultation across all sectors. The JTC held its first meeting on 28 February 2024, during which four main priorities of the new Cooperation Framework were endorsed. This was followed by technical sub-group meetings on 25-26 March to elaborate on the proposed areas of UN engagement over the next five years. Sub-national consultations were also conducted in Erbil, Basra, Mosul, and Kirkuk.





UN Iraq and Ministry of Water Resources Launched "Water is Life" Campaign to Tackle Water Crisis

On July 22, the United Nations in Iraq, in partnership with the Ministry of Water Resources, launched the year-long "Water is Life - Every Drop Counts" campaign to address Iraq's severe water crisis. The campaign aims to raise awareness about water conservation, the effects of climate change, and promote collective action to protect water resources. UN Resident Coordinator Ghulam Mohammed Isaczai stressed the urgency of upgrading water systems, preventing pollution, and investing in sustainable water management. 
UN's Strategic Role in the 4th Baghdad International Water Conference and Beyond

Baghdad - From April 27 to 29, 2024, Iraq hosted the 4thBaghdad International Water Conference (BIWC) under the theme "Towards a Better Water Future: Together We Can". The UN RC and the UNCT role were pivotal highlighting the UN's commitment to addressing water scarcity and climate challenges through regional cooperation. The RC underscored Iraq's obligation to the UN Water Convention, drawing on successful examples like Kazakhstan, and emphasized the importance of transboundary water cooperation for regional stability. Discussions focused on improving water management, sustainable agriculture, and climate resilience. The RC proposed a National Policy Dialogue within the Water Convention framework, stressing the inclusion of all stakeholders and the need for comprehensive coverage of water issues in Iraq. The RC reiterated the UN's readiness to support Iraq in implementing the conference's recommendations, fostering regional integration, and promoting sustainable water management solutions.



DSRSG/RC/HC Isaczai meets with returnees in Salah al-Din

Salah al-Din - On 22 May, DSRSG/RC/HC for Iraq Ghulam M. Isaczai visited Yathrib District in southern Salah al-Din and met with a group of internally displaced families who had recently returned from Ashti camp in Sulaymaniyah, east of the Kurdistan Region of Iraq. The DSRSG acknowledged the efforts of the Government and the significant progress made in ensuring the safe and dignified return of displaced persons. He also recognized the ongoing challenges that returnees face, including the need for shelters, sustainable livelihoods, and access to essential services. The DSRSG also met separately with Salah Din Governor, Badr Mahmoud Al-Jubouri. Their discussions focused on enhancing cooperation on the provision of support and services to newly returned IDPs. DSRSG/RC/HC and Salah Din Governor Badr Mahmoud Al-Jubouri launched the Salah Din Joint Coordination Forum, a platform aimed at improving coordination between local government and development partners to better address the needs of the community.



Strengthening Local Partnerships through JCF

Between May and September, the Development Support Office facilitated 14 Joint Coordination Framework (JCF) meetings in Kirkuk, Mosul, Salah al-Din, Anbar, and Diyala. Co-chaired by local governments and humanitarian and development actors, the meetings addressed key issues such as development, climate change impacts, and durable solutions. Discussions also focused on the challenges and needs of returnees to their areas of origin, improving service provision, and strengthening partnerships.









Promoting Volunteerism for SDGs: UNV and UN Partners Engage Students Across Iraq

In May 2024, a team from UNV, the UN Resident Coordinator's Office, and UNDP Iraq held sessions at the University of Basra, American University of Kurdistan, and Erbil Polytechnic University. These sessions highlighted the importance of volunteerism in advancing the SDGs in Iraq and shared successful experiences of UN Volunteers, inspiring students and alumni to engage in volunteerism and contribute to positive change. Baghdad, on July 2024, UNMAS Iraq concluded a training course on the use of drones in operations to safely and efficiently survey areas and minimize explosive ordnance risks to operators. Baghdad, on 22 May, the Ministry of Education, EU, UNESCO, and UNICEF launched the ITALEEM equitable quality education program in Iraq. This initiative aims to strengthen the Ministry's capacity, impacting over 100,000 teachers and 30,000 schools, and reaching more than 10 million students. ITALEEM focuses on improving governance, enhancing teacher training, and fostering school-community partnerships. Mosul, July 16, UNESCO, with financial support from ALIPH and in cooperation with the Iraqi Ministry of Culture and the Dominican Order, completed the rehabilitation of the House of Prayer at Al-Saa'a Convent in Mosul. The restoration, part of UNESCO's "Revive the Spirit of Mosul" initiative, preserved the site's historical integrity while modernizing its facilities, including eco-friendly features. Mosul- 20 July - As the seventh anniversary of Mosul's liberation approaches, UNESCO highlights its achievements through the "Revive the Spirit of Mosul" initiative, supported by the UAE, EU, and other partners. Key successes include the reconstruction of iconic landmarks like Al-Nouri Mosque, Al-Hadba Minaret, and Al-Saa'a Convent, the restoration of 124 heritage houses, and the creation of over 6,200 jobs. UN Women Hosts Strategic Meeting to Advance Women's Empowerment in Iraq

Erbil - On 29 August, UN Women convened a coordination meeting with the National Directorate for Iraqi Women (NDIW) and the High Council for Women and Development (HCWD) to bolster women's empowerment and security in Iraq. The meeting focused on strengthening collaboration between national and regional entities, reviewing achievements such as the National Strategy for Iraqi Women 2023–2030, and outlining initiatives for 2024. Key plans include the Iraqi Women's Data Platform and a Women's Institute for Security and Peace, with a focus on sustained efforts to advance the Women, Peace, and Security agenda. UN Women Reaffirms Support for Yazidi Survivors at Sixth Lalish Conference

Erbil - 25 June, At the Sixth Lalish Conference for Peace and Coexistence in Erbil, UN Women Iraq Representative Ajay Madiwale highlighted the socio-economic and psychological challenges faced by Yazidi survivors, emphasizing the need for sustained assistance and social reintegration. He reiterated UN Women's commitment to providing support through awareness-raising, economic, and psychological services. The conference, attended by key Iraqi and international officials, focused on the 10th anniversary of the Yazidi Genocide, peace in Sinjar, and preventing sexual violence in conflict. Empowering Iraqi SMEs through Food Safety Training

Bardarash - From 8 to 11 July UNIDO, in collaboration with the Iraqi Ministry of Industry and Minerals, conducted Food Safety and Hygiene Training for SMEs, as part of the Japan-funded "Emergency Livelihood Support" project. The training, involving 27 participants from family-owned businesses in yogurt, tahini, and pickles, emphasized inclusivity, with women and IDPs attending. Covering key topics like raw material handling and food safety protocols, the training enhanced product quality and safety. FAO Launches Campaign to Clean Hawizeh Marshes

On 26 August, FAO Iraq, in collaboration with the Iraqi government and local authorities, launched a 10-day campaign to clean the Al-Hawizeh Marsh from plastic waste, removing an estimated 100 cubic meters of pollution. This initiative, part of the "Water is Life" campaign, aims to protect water resources and wetlands from the impacts of climate change and water scarcity. FAO Representative Dr. Salah El-Hajj Hassan emphasized the importance of collective efforts to safeguard the marshes and ensure the well-being of communities reliant on these ecosystems. Promoting Sustainable Agriculture with Mechanical Rice Transplanters in Najaf

Najaf - on 7 July, FAO, in partnership with the Najaf Directorate of Agriculture and supported by the Ministries of Agriculture and Water Resources, launched a pioneering initiative in Al-Mishkhab district to promote sustainable agriculture using mechanical rice transplanters. This climate-smart technology, part of a SIDA-funded project, saves


FAO Boosts Resilient Fodder Production in Southern Iraq

On 28 May, FAO Iraq, in partnership with the Ministry of Agriculture, launched an innovative project to enhance agricultural resilience in Southern Iraq by introducing climate-smart practices and resilient fodder crops. With support from the EU, farmers are adopting high-yield varieties like rye grass and Sudanese sorghum, significantly increasing milk production and livestock health. Empowering Southern Iraqi Dairy Producers through FAO-EU Initiative

Basra - On 19 May, FAO Iraq, in collaboration with the Ministry of Agriculture, launched a major dairy equipment

distribution campaign targeting 5,000 beneficiaries in Basra, Thi Qar, and Missan, with 50% of them being women. This initiative, part of the EU-funded project "Restoration and Strengthening the Resilience of Agri-Food Systems," aims to improve dairy production standards and uplift rural livelihoods, particularly empowering women in the marshes. The distribution of modern dairy tools enhances milk hygiene and production efficiency, contributing to sustainable agriculture and community resilience in Southern Iraq. reforms in Iraq. Despite legal reforms, Iraq's pension system remains fragmented and inequitable, disproportionately benefiting formal workers and creating fiscal burdens. The note calls for reforms that promote equity, sustainability, and inclusivity, especially for women and informal workers, to ensure income protection in old age and align the system with international labour standards. Capacity Building on Governance and Empowering Society

Sinjar District - July, A major milestone was achieved with the distribution of 500 title deeds (tapoos) to Yazidi households in Sinjar, marking an end to over 40 years of discrimination against the community. In response to the housing crisis in Ninewa, UN-Habitat also launched a social housing complex in June to develop the Rajm Hadeed neighborhood as part of the Mosul Master Plan, known as the Japan Village project. UN-Habitat continues to provide durable solutions for securing tenure, protecting the rights of vulnerable minorities, and aligning Iraq's development with the Sustainable Development Goals. UNODC Strengthens Regional Counter-Narcotics Efforts at 2nd Baghdad International Conference

From 21 to 25 July 2024, Ms. Cristina Albertin, UNODC Regional Representative for the Middle East and North Africa, conducted an official mission to Iraq. Her visit included participation in the 2nd Baghdad International Conference on Countering Narcotics, where Prime Minister H.E. Mohammed Shia' Al Sudani hosted discussions with eight countries affected by drug trafficking. During the conference, UNODC presented its key report, "Drug Trafficking Dynamics across Iraq and the Middle East (2019-2023): Trends and Responses," which offers a comprehensive analysis of regional drug trafficking trends and recommendations for enhancing counter-narcotics efforts. Workshop on Effectiveness of Terrorism Financing and Targeted Financial Sanctions (TFS)

Amman - UNODC organized a 3-day workshop on Countering the Financing of Terrorism and implementing Targeted Financial Sanctions. The event brought together senior Iraqi officials from the Supreme Judiciary Council, State Council, Financial Intelligence Unit (FIU), Company Registrar, and the Kurdistan Region Prime Minister's Office, alongside Jordan's FIU. Participants discussed the effectiveness of Targeted Financial Sanctions as a key tool in combating terrorism, emphasizing the importance of regional and cross-sector collaboration.



Iraq's Green Growth Strategy: A Roadmap for Sustainable Development and Economic Diversification

Erbil - 30-31 August, Iraq is launching its Green Growth Strategy (GGS), a key framework for balancing economic growth with social and environmental sustainability. Developed in collaboration with ministries, led by the Ministry of Planning and the Ministry of Environment, and supported by UNDP, the GGS focuses on economic diversification, resource efficiency in water, energy, and food, and job creation for the youth. By uniting public and private sectors, it aims for inclusive, sustainable growth. A consultation workshop on the first draft of the GGS was held in Erbil.



Enhancing education opportunities for refugee children in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq

In Basirma, Erbil - August, UNHCR, along with the General Directorate of Erbil Education and the KRG Ministry of Education, opened a nine-classroom school in Basirma, Erbil, benefiting over 400 students. Since 2022, UNHCR has built 76 additional classrooms in the KR-I enabling nearly 5,500 more refugee children to enroll in school in 2023 – an 11% increase from 2022.



Administrative Instructions on the affairs of asylum-seekers for the Kurdistan Region of Iraq launched

KRI - On 10 July, In an official ceremony, the Minister of Interior of the Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG), H.E. Rebar Ahmed Khalid, signed into effect the Administrative Instructions (Als) for regulating the affairs of asylum-seekers in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KR-I). This is a landmark achievement for the KRG and comes after years of advocacy and technical support by UNHCR to Iraqi authorities to develop and adopt a new Refugee Law that aligns with international standards while, in parallel, establishing Als – one for Federal Iraq and one for the KR-I – given the lengthy process required for the drafting and enactment of the bill.



ILO Director-General's Visit

Baghdad - During his visit to Iraq on 27-28 April, ILO Director-General Gilbert F. Houngbo met with Iraq's President, Prime Minister, and other officials to discuss advancing social justice and ensuring decent work. He also engaged with social partners and youth representatives, emphasizing the importance of transitioning from emergency relief to development. UNHCR and ITC Collaborate to Empower Refugees in Iraq



Launch of the WB, ILO, IMF Study on Pension Reform

May - A new study by the World Bank, ILO, and IMF aims to reform Iraq's fragmented and inequitable pension system. The study evaluates fiscal sustainability, labor market implications, coverage, and benefit adequacy. It proposes reforms to make the system inclusive, fiscally sustainable, and conducive to private sector development. There commendations include aligning public and private sector pensions, ensuring benefit adequacy, and extending coverage to informal workers, women, and other disadvantaged groups. With the support of Mr. Khalaf Sinjari, the Advisor to the Prime Minister for Yazidi Affairs, and Dr. Ali Fawzi, Head of the Legal Department in the Council of Ministers, the Executive Committee discussed the progress of implementing the legal decree and issuing title deeds (tapoos) across all 11 mujamaats in Sinjar. 
Reconstruction of Al-Ekhlaas School in Mosul




